NATURE FRIENDLY EAKRING Winter Blackbirds

My garden has been hopping with Blackbirds. Often 20 or more are feeding on windfall apples that I've saved to scatter on the grass when the weather gets icy. They pluck the ivy berries too, which conveniently ripen in the winter.

Some of the birds may be local nesters. Others will have made a short migration within the UK, moving south and west for milder weather and some are likely to be from Scandinavia and eastern Europe.

Ringing studies show that the winter visitors often return to the same gardens each year. They must have a taste for Nottinghamshire Bramley apples?

- 3. Drink loose leaf tea? Add them to your compost bin along with your kitchen scraps.


EAKRING WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

The next Meeting is on Tuesday 15th February 7.15p.m in the Cator Hall This Meeting is organised by the members as a surprise for the Committee??


