The Parish Council does not normally meet in August but this year the opportunity was taken to have an informal meeting of residents to discuss the Solar Farm development ahead of their presentation to the Council scheduled for **Wednesday September 4th**. Please make a note of this date and come along to **Cator Hall at 6.30pm** to have your views heard.

National Grid volunteer team have made a huge difference in the village with a major project clearing the Syke.....see back page.

The Councillors are in negotiations with County Council / VIA and District to identify areas where work needs to be undertaken on verges, footpaths and byways and we are awaiting information to create a definitive map of responsibilities that can be monitored effectively going forward.

Work on Cator hall is ongoing and will be continuing with an anticipated re-launch event in October 2024.

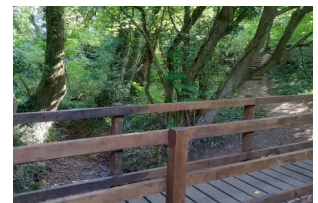
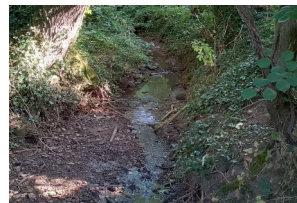

The above location can be found following the footpath from Triumph Rd and passing by the Playing Field.

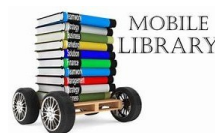
