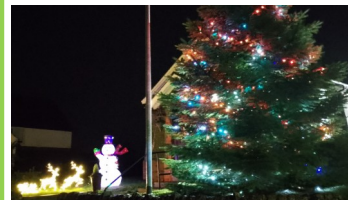


CHRISTMAS LIGHTS SWITCH-ON
